



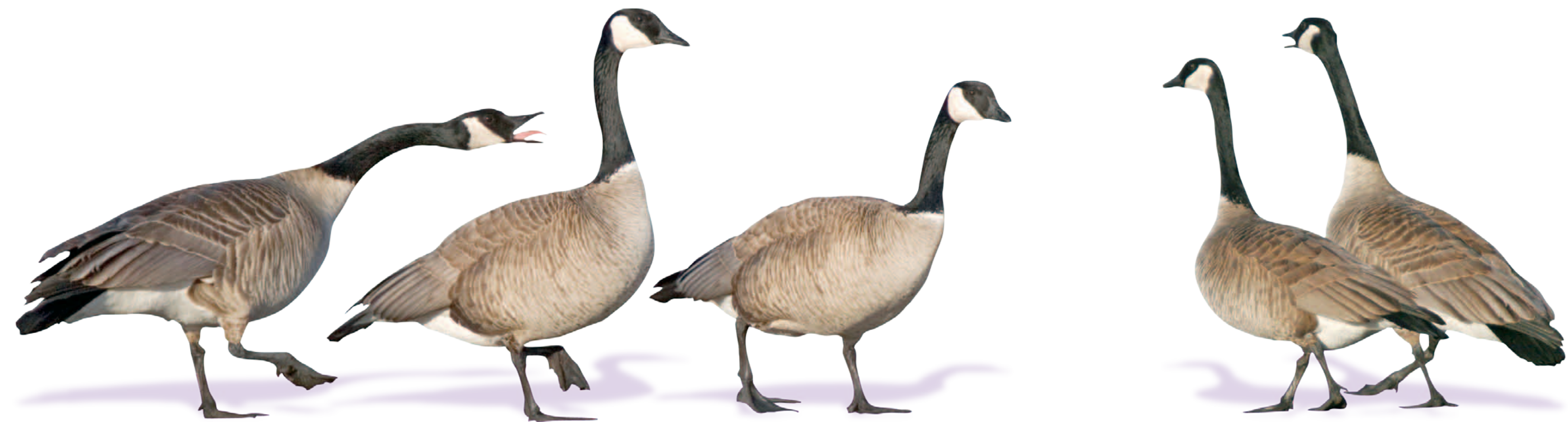
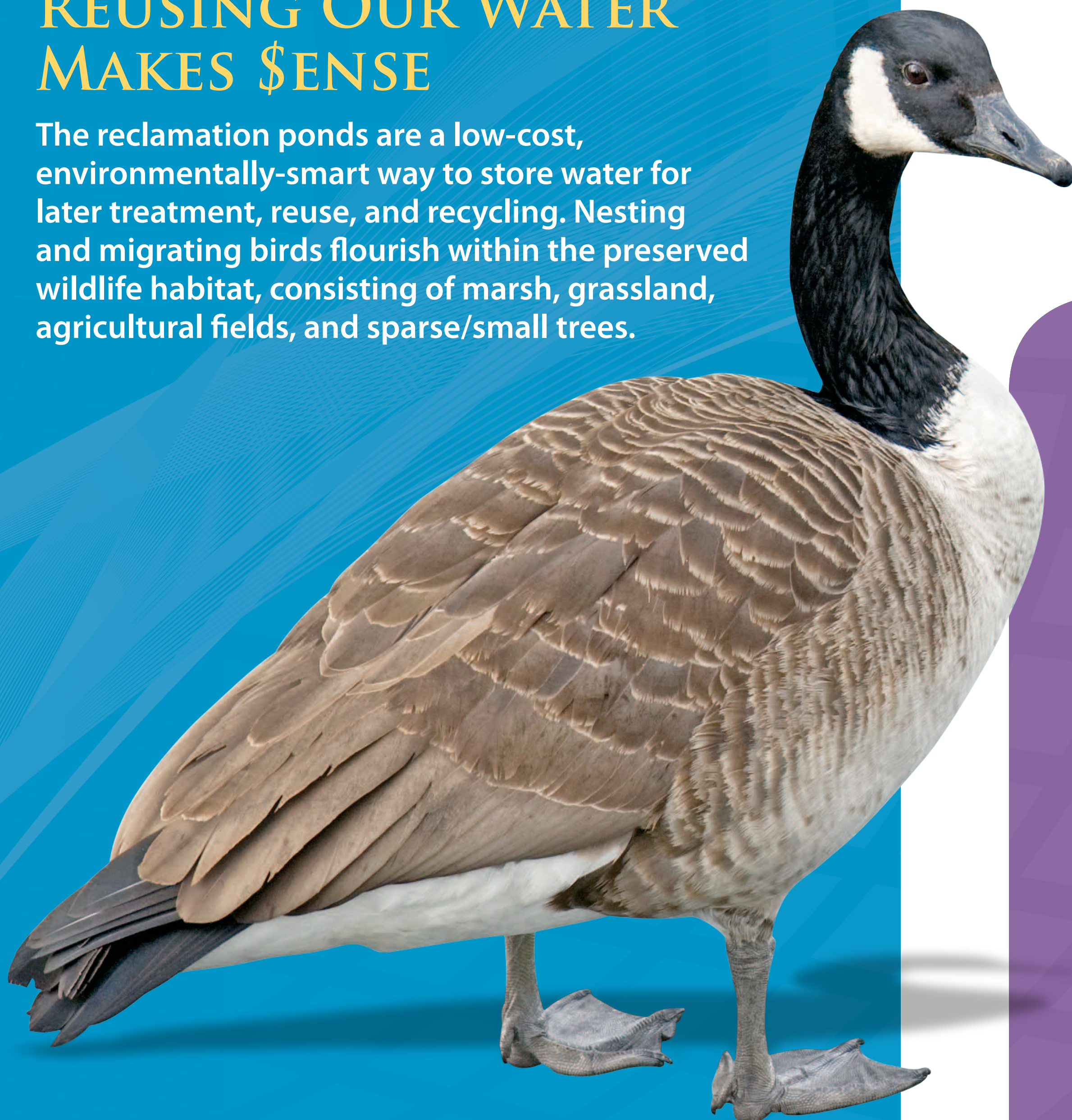
Please Do Not Feed the Geese

TOO MANY GEESE HARM OTHER WILDLIFE AND MAKE IT HARDER AND MORE COSTLY TO RECYCLE AND REUSE WATER

More than 150 species of birds have been seen on the site. Some are negatively impacted by goose overpopulation.

RECLAMATION: REUSING OUR WATER MAKES \$ENSE

The reclamation ponds are a low-cost, environmentally-smart way to store water for later treatment, reuse, and recycling. Nesting and migrating birds flourish within the preserved wildlife habitat, consisting of marsh, grassland, agricultural fields, and sparse/small trees.



HOW FOWL ARE MOFFITT'S CANADA GOOSE?

OUR OVERPOPULATION OF GEESE HARMS THE RECLAMATION AREA

Moffitt's Canada Goose are large, aggressive birds.

A growing overpopulation is:

- Fouling the reclamation ponds with huge amounts of feces—up to one pound per day from each goose;
- Damaging habitat quality and biological diversity for other birds and wildlife;
- Potentially spreading disease to birds and people;
- Increasing the cost of treating reclaimed water and/or making it difficult to recycle and reuse.

SOLUTIONS TO GOOSE DAMAGE

We are developing a safe and humane Goose Management plan. It will help preserve high quality habitat for healthy, diverse wildlife populations.
