RESOLUTION OF THE DISTRICT BOARD OF THE LAS GALLINAS VALLEY SANITARY DISTRICT PURSUANT TO PUBLIC CONTRACT CODE SECTION 20101 ADOPTING A UNIFORM SYSTEM OF RATING BIDDERS AND AN APPEAL PROCESS FOR THE PRE-QUALIFICATION OF PROSPECTIVE BIDDERS FOR THE SECONDARY TREATMENT AND RECYCLED WATER PLANT UPGRADE PROJECT

WHEREAS, the District is subject to competitive bidding requirements for all projects valued at or in excess of \$15,000.

WHEREAS, section 20101 of the California Public Contracts Code authorizes the District to engage in a process of pre-qualifying prospective bidders for public works construction projects.

WHEREAS, Section 20101 of the California Public Contracts Code requires that any agency requiring prospective bidders to complete and submit questionnaires and financial statements as part of a pre-qualification process must also adopt and, apply a uniform system based on objective criteria for rating bidders on the basis of the completed questionnaires and financial statements, in order to determine both the minimum requirements permitted for qualification to bid, and the type and size of the contracts upon which each bidder shall be deemed qualified to bid.

WHEREAS, Section 20101 of the California Public Contracts Code further requires that any agency employing procedures for pre-qualification of prospective bidders also establish a process that will allow prospective bidders to dispute their proposed pre-qualification rating prior to the closing time for receipt of bids.

WHEREAS, Section 20101 allows a public agency to establish a pre-qualification procedure linked to a single project.

WHEREAS, the District had embarked on a project to upgrade the existing wastewater treatment and recycled water facilities, a specialty public works project demanding the skills, knowledge and financial soundness of a public works contractor experienced in constructing similar projects.

WHEREAS, the District Board desires to adopt a uniform rating system and appeals process in order to use the pre-qualification process authorized by Section 20101 of the California Public Contracts Code for the Secondary Treatment and Recycled Water Plant Upgrade project.

**RESOLVED,** by the District Board of the Las Gallinas Valley Sanitary District, Marin County, California that:

1. The District hereby approves and adopts the uniform system based on

- objective criteria for rating bidders on the basis of the completed questionnaires and financial statements, attached hereto, and by this reference, incorporated herein as Exhibit "A" to this resolution.
- 2. The District hereby approves and adopts the process to allow prospective bidders to dispute their proposed pre-qualification rating prior to the closing time for receipt of bids, attached hereto, and by this reference, incorporated herein in Exhibit "A" to this resolution.

#### INTRODUCTION:

The Las Gallinas Valley Sanitary District (District) Wastewater Treatment Facility has experienced numerous upgrades over the past fifty plus years. The plant treats the liquid stream with a headworks, primary clarification, trickling filter treatment, secondary clarification, a fixed film reactor, sand filtration and chorine disinfection. Additionally, the facility has a recycled water plant that treats secondary effluent and return pond water for use as recycled water.

This upgrade will add primary equalization, replace secondary treatment with a hybrid fixed-film, activated sludge process, increase secondary clarifier capacity, provide disinfection modifications, modify solids thickening, expand recycled water treatment capacity, improve the facility site, provide odor control, and include other site, mechanical, and electrical improvements as required.

A Location Map of the project site is included in Appendix A. Appendix B provides the 60% complete design plans for the Plant Expansion.

This pre-qualification submittal package is intended for general contractors and electrical subcontractor(s). General contractor shall understand that if their company is approved, it is mandatory that they utilize a pre-approved electrical subcontractor. General Contractors must have a California Class "A" license and Electrical Subcontractors must have a California "C-10" license.

The scoring instructions and the scoreable point system for each category in order for a submitting contractor to pre-qualify is included in Appendix C.

General contractors interested in receiving the bid packages for the Las Gallinas Valley Sanitary District (District) Secondary Treatment and Recycled Water Plant Upgrade project must be pre-qualified by the District. Consequently, interested general contractors are requested to submit a Statement of Qualifications for evaluation. Only those general contractors and electrical sub-contractors who are pre-qualified in accordance with the requirements contained herein will be eligible to receive the Invitation for Bid documents and submit a bid to the DISTRICT for this project.

The proposed work is tentatively scheduled to bid in June 2017 with construction commencing in September 2017. The project construction schedule is anticipated to be 1,000 calendar days. The estimated construction cost for the project is \$42,000,000.

## PRE-QUALIFICATION PROCEDURE

#### A. PURPOSE:

- 1. The purpose of the Pre-qualification Procedure is to provide DISTRICT with a mechanism to evaluate and determine which general contractors are qualified to participate in this project and provide a plant expansion contract bid proposal directly to the DISTRICT.
- 2. General contractors are required to comply with the Pre-qualification Procedure.
- 3. Only those general contractors and electrical subcontractor(s), who have duly complied with the Pre-qualification Procedure and have been determined to be qualified, will be eligible to receive and submit a bid on the project at a later date.

#### B. SUBMITTALS:

- 1. Contractors wishing to Pre-qualify to Bid shall submit the following:
  - a. General contractor's or Electrical Subcontractor's Application to Prequalify to Bid.
  - b. General contractor's or Electrical Subcontractor's Pre-qualification Statement.
  - c. General contractor or Electrical Subcontractor's Questionnaire.
  - d. Attachments as necessary to provide supporting information required by the general contractor's or electrical subcontractor's Qualification Statement and/or Questionnaire.
  - f. On a separate sheet(s), provide a complete listing of all projects of a similar nature to the proposed project together with a statement regarding total number of years of experience your company has had with similar projects. Be detailed in your project description. See scoring instructions Section III (page SI-12)
  - g. On a separate sheet(s), provide your plan, methodology and sequencing for performing the proposed work (be as specific as possible). Include and Address: Approach to construction items of proposed work, including work to be provided by a sub-contractor. Note: The Plant Facility must remain in service throughout the duration of the construction. See scoring instructions Section IV (Page SI-15) for additional requirements.
  - h. On a separate sheet(s), provide a list of all current employees and their job classification for those employees which would have involvement on the proposed project; and provide an organizational chart and indentify the key personnel that are anticipated to comprise the management team of this project. Provide resumes for key personnel along with their experience.
  - i. On a separate sheet(s), provide a list of all equipment owned by the contractor and available for use on this project.

- j. On a separate sheet(s), provide a list of all Responsible Managing employees (RME) or Responsible Managing Officer (RMO).
- 2. One (1) electronic copy of the Application and all supporting data shall be submitted.
- 3. Pre-qualification Statement and the Application shall be signed by an officer of the firm.
- 4. Applications shall be submitted prior to the Deadline for Submittals as described above.
- 5. Applications that are incomplete or illegible, for any reason, may be rejected at the discretion of the DISTRICT. Determination of the completeness of the applications will be at the sole discretion of the DISTRICT.
- 6. DISTRICT reserves the right to waive any informality and/or request additional information from the general contractor, at its discretion.
- 7. By submitting an Application, the general contractor agrees that the DISTRICT shall be free to make inquiry(ies) it deems necessary to ascertain the qualification(s) of the general contractor and/or the accuracy of statements made by the general contractor as to its qualification(s).

#### C. ADDENDA

- 1. Any clarifications, alterations, or changes made shall not be valid unless included in an Addendum issued by the DISTRICT.
- 2. Addenda will be mailed or delivered to those general contractors who have received the Pre-qualify to Bid Package from the DISTRICT.
- 3. Each general contractor shall ascertain from the DISTRICT prior to submitting their Application that they have received all Addenda issued and they shall acknowledge their receipt in the Application.
- 4. The deadline for submittal questions and requests for clarification to the DISTRICT is 2:30 pm (PST) on April 28, 2017.

#### D. EVALUATION

1. The objective of the evaluation is to determine which general contractors, in the opinion of the DISTRICT, are qualified to perform the work required for the Project. General contractors are cautioned that this is a subjective process and that they retain sole responsibility for adequately demonstrating their own abilities, so that they are perceived to be qualified.

- 2. The information contained in the Application will be evaluated by the DISTRICT. Information concerning the Pre-qualification Procedure for the Project should be directed to DISTRICT.
- 3. Perception of the general contractor's or electrical subcontractor's qualification to perform will be based on the evaluation of the general contractor's:
  - a. Financial capabilities
  - b. Resources
    - 1. Equipment.
    - 2. Key staff/Personnel experience.
      - Field Superintendent.
      - Office Project Manager.
  - c. Past Performance
    - 1. Past experience with the DISTRICT.
    - 2. Past experience with other similar Agencies.
    - 3. Timely completion of past projects.
    - 4. Past performance constructing wastewater treatment projects while maintaining continuous operation.
  - d. Plan, methodology and sequencing for performing work on this project; considering the facility must remain in service for the entire duration of construction.
  - e. Other Information
    - 1. Available from the Application.
    - 2. Available from research and verification of the information.
    - 3. Available from sources outside the scope of the Application.
    - 4. Current workload.
    - 5. Statement of experience (10 years minimum).
- 4. Additional information or clarification may be requested after the Application has been submitted. Such requests shall be responded to by general contractors or electrical subcontractor's within (3) calendar days after receipt of such requests.
- 5. It is intended that the information contained in the Application will be researched and verified.
- 6. Information found to be materially incorrect or misleading will be sufficient cause not to Pre-qualify the general contractor or electrical subcontractor's.
- 7. Reasons for not pre-qualifying a general contractor or electrical subcontractor may include, but not be limited to, the following:

- a. The general contractor or electrical subcontractor does not have the demonstrated experience to perform the contract.
- b. The general contractor or electrical subcontractor (or any officer, director, or owner thereof) has had judgments entered against him/her within the past ten years for breach of contract.
- c. The general contractor or electrical subcontractor has been in substantial non-compliance with the terms and conditions of prior (or comparable) contracts without good cause.
- d. The general contractor or electrical subcontractor (or any officer, director, owner, project manager, or chief financial officer thereof) has been convicted within the last ten years of a crime related to construction or contracting.
- e. The general contractor or electrical subcontractor (or any officer, director, or owner thereof) is currently debarred pursuant to an established debarment procedure from bidding or contracting by any public body, agency of another state, or agency of the Federal government.
- f. The general contractor or electrical subcontractor (or electrical subcontractor) fails to achieve the required points in the scoreable sections of the evaluation.
- g. The general contractor or electrical subcontractor fails to provide, in a timely manner, any information requested by DISTRICT relevant to 7a. through 7f. (above).

#### E. NOTIFICATION OF ELIGIBILITY FOR BIDDING

- 1. All general contractors or electrical subcontractor submitting an Application will be notified of DISTRICT's determination, normally within thirty (30) days from the Deadline for Submittals.
- 2. In the event that a general contractor or electrical subcontractor is denied prequalification, a written notification shall state the reasons for such denial of prequalification and the factual basis of such reasons.
- 3. Determinations by DISTRICT will be final and conclusive.
- 4. A list of general contractors and electrical subcontractors determined to be Prequalified to Bid will be made available in the Bid Documents.
- F. SELECTION OF PRE-QUALIFIED GENERAL CONTRACTORS AND ELECTRICAL SUBCONTRACTORS

- 1. Selection for General Contractor eligibility to provide bid proposals to DISTRICT shall only be made from packages submitted by pre-qualified, responsive and responsible entities who sufficiently meet the terms, conditions and specifications contained in the submittal package.
- 2. Selection for Electrical Subcontractor eligibility to provide bid proposals to prequalified General Contractors shall only be made from packages submitted by pre-qualified, responsive and responsible entities who sufficiently meet the terms, conditions and specifications contained in the submittal package.
- 3. DISTRICT reserves the right to conduct interviews if deemed necessary. However, under all circumstances and all statements to the contrary notwithstanding, DISTRICT reserves as its right, the right to determine the qualified general contractor(s) in accordance with the best interest of the DISTRICT.

#### G. APPEAL PROCEDURE

In conjunction with this pre-qualification procedure, DISTRICT has also established a Contractor Pre-Qualification Appeals Panel ("Appeal Panel") consisting of the following, or their designees (s):

Mark Williams - General Manager Michael Cortez, P.E. - District Engineer Mel Liebmann - Plant Manager Justin Logan, P.E. - Aqua Engineering Brian Knoll, P.E. - Albert A. Webb Associates

The sole issue before the Appeals Panel, in any appeal requested by a nonprequalified contractor, shall be the scoring of the contractor. The decision of the Appeals Panel shall be DISTRICT's final administrative decision.

- (a) Where a complete and timely submitted application results in a rating below the necessary to pre-qualify, an appeal can be made. An appeal is begun by the contractor delivering notice to DISTRICT of its appeal of the decision with respect to its pre-qualification rating, no later than five (5) business days after the date of DISTRICT's notice of the negative pre-qualification determination. Without a timely appeal, the contractor waives any and all rights to challenge the decision of the DISTRICT, whether by administrative process, judicial process or any other legal process or proceeding.
- (b) If the contractor gives the required notice of appeal and requests a hearing, the hearing shall be conducted so that it is concluded no later than five (5) business days after DISTRICT's receipt of the notice of appeal, and no later than five (5) business days prior to the last date for the receipt of bids on the Project. The hearing shall be an informal process conducted by the Appeals

Panel to whom DISTRICT's governing board has delegated responsibility to hear such appeals. At or prior to the hearing, the contractor will be advised of the basis for DISTRICT's pre-qualification determination in writing. The contractor will be given the opportunity to present information and present reasons in opposition to the rating. Within one day after the conclusion of the hearing, the Appeals Panel will render its decision. It is the intention of the DISTRICT that the date for the submission and opening of bids will not be delayed or postponed to allow for completion of an appeal process.

**Note:** A contractor may receive a negative pre-qualification determination for the project if the contractor fails to meet DISTRICT's minimum requirements. In addition, a contractor may be found not pre-qualified for either: (1) Omission of requested information; or (2) Falsification of information.

Discuss any proposed temporary by-pass system for electrical, piping, etc., or other methods as required, for maintaining sewage operations for the plant throughout the construction process. Be specific and identify critical activities, sequences and components of the work that may be affected.
- c. Provide a representative sample start up sequencing plan for a similar construction project completed by your company within the past two years. If a previous sample is not available then contractor can create a sample start up sequencing plan for the Primary Pump Station and Modification of the Primary Biofilter (Phase 1) improvements for this facility.
- d. Identify any potential risks and/or variables that may affect the project.
- e. Describe in detail your proposed method(s) for Primary Pump Station and Modification of the Primary Biofilter (Phase 1) during the demolition phase in conjunction with maintaining plant operation.

- f. Designate your safety officer and provide the resume. Detail your jobsite safety program and identify any specific issues such as anticipated confined space entry. Provide a copy of your IIPP (Injury and Illness Prevention Program).
- g. Outline and detail your procedures for communications during all phases of the contract work among all involved parties.
- h. Outline and detail your approach to quality control.
- i. Describe your experience in providing temporary generator power during electrical demolition and switchovers.
- j. Describe your approach for field verifying and documenting accurate locations for existing underground utilities, particularly where demolition work is proposed and/or points of connection.

#### APPENDIX C

#### A LIST OF THE SCORABLE QUESTIONS AND THE SCORING INSTRUCTIONS

The information, questions and scoring methodologies detailed herein apply to both the general contractor submittal and the selected electrical subcontractor submittal packages, unless otherwise stated.

The **scorable** questions arise in three different areas:

- (I) <u>History of the business and organizational performance</u>;
- (II) Compliance with occupational safety and health laws, workers' compensation and other labor legislation; and
- (III) Completion of recent projects and quality of performance.
- (IV) Project specific scoring.

The interview questions (interviews by the public agency of project managers on projects completed recently by the contractor) are included in group IV. In a pre-qualification procedure for a <u>single project</u>, Category III would also include a scoring of the number of recently completed projects that are similar to the project on which pre-qualification is at issue. Category IV contains questions regarding parameters that are intended to be more specific to the project for which the contractor is applying for pre-qualification.

**Note:** Not all questions in the questionnaire are scorable; some questions simply ask for information about the contractor firm's structure, officers and history. This document includes only those questions that are "scorable." The question numbers in this document are the numbers used in the questionnaire. Thus, the questions included here begin with question number 6, and there are a few breaks in the numerical sequence.

#### The Scores Needed for Prequalification

To prequalify, a contractor would be required to have a passing grade within <u>each</u> of the four large categories referred to above.

**For Section I**, "History of the business and organizational performance," Department of Industrial Relations (DIR) recommends use of a passing score of 57 on this portion of the questionnaire (of a maximum score of 76 on this portion of the questionnaire).

For Section II, Compliance with occupational safety and health laws, workers' compensation and other labor legislation DIR recommends use of a passing score of 38 on this portion of the questionnaire (of a maximum score of 53 points on this portion of the questionnaire).

Section III, Completion of recent projects and quality of performance, includes questions about recently completed (public or private) construction projects. For previous projects completed, a passing score of 52 (of a maximum 70) is required.

DIR makes no recommendation about how to score a contractor's answers about recently completed past projects. Because of the wide range of projects that a public agency may be planning, and the similarly wide range in the skills, abilities, and experience that a public agency will consider most important for a pending project, it is impossible to propose a useful model scoring system to apply to the answers given about a contractor's completed projects. Accordingly, scoring for this category shall be in accordance with the point system set forth herein for evaluating the similar projects and the accompanying degree of similarity.

**Section IV**, <u>Project specific scoring</u>, includes specific questions which may directly or indirectly affect the specific project for which the contractor is applying for prequalification; and also includes a series of interview questions

For this proposed project, a passing score of **90** (of a maximum 120) is required for the non-interview questions. For the interview questions, DIR recommends that a public agency interview project managers for the owners of two completed projects. DIR recommends a scoring system that would allow a maximum score of 120 points for each interview. For these questions, DIR recommends qualification for a contractor whose score on each of two interviews is 72 points or more; a denial of pre-qualification for a contractor whose score on either interview is less than 55 points; and an additional interview with another reference if the score resulting from one interview is between 55 points and 72 points.

- c. Provide a representative sample start up sequencing plan for a similar construction project completed by your company within the past two years. If a previous sample is not available then contractor can create a sample start up sequencing plan for the Primary Pump Station and Modification of the Primary Biofilter (Phase 1) improvements for this facility. (14 points)
- d. Identify any potential risks and/or variables that may affect the project. (12 points)
- e. (GENERAL CONTRACTOR) Detail your plan for maintaining continuous operation of the plant during construction of Primary Pump Station and Modification of the Primary Biofilter (Phase 1). (12 points)
  - (ELECTRICAL CONTRACTOR) Detail your plan for maintaining continuous operation of the plant during construction of Primary Pump Station and Modification of the Primary Biofilter (Phase 1). (12 points)

#### MODEL INTERVIEW QUESTIONS

The following questions will be used to interview randomly selected contacts from <u>at least two</u> completed projects. DISTRICT will conduct the interviews. No action on the contractor's part is necessary. These questions are included on the package given to the contractor for information only.

The highest possible score is 120 Points. A score less than 55 points disqualifies a contractor from bidding on projects that are proposed by DISTRICT. A score of between 56 and 72 indicates DISTRICT should conduct an interview of another contact, that is, a manager of another completed project. A score of 72 or higher on each of two interviews is sufficient for pre-qualification.

First, please give a brief description of the project. (Project description by interviewer)

- 1. Are there any outstanding stop notices, liens, or claims by the contractor that are currently unresolved on contracts for which notices of completion were recorded more than 120 days ago? (1 point for each is deducted from overall score; maximum amount to be deducted is 5 points)
- 2. On a scale of 1-10, with 10 being the best, did the contractor provide adequate personnel? (Max. 10 points)
- 3. On a scale of 1-10, with 10 being the best, did the contractor provide adequate supervision? (Max. 10 points)
- 4. On a scale of 1-10, with 10 being the best, was there adequate equipment provided on the job? (Max. 10 points)
- 5. On a scale of 1-10, with 10 being the best, was the contractor timely in providing reports and other paperwork, including change order paperwork and scheduling updates? (Max. 10 points)
- 6. On a scale of 1-10, with 10 being the best, did the contractor adhere to the project schedule that your [agency] [business] approved? (Max. 10 points)
- 7. Was the project completed on time? (10 points if the answer is "Yes").

  Or, if the answer is "no," on a scale of 1-10, with 10 being the best, to what extent was the contractor responsible for the delay in completion?
- 8. On a scale of 1-10, with 10 being the best, rate the contractor on the timely submission of reasonable cost and time estimates to perform change order work. (Max. 10 points)

- 9. On a scale of 1-10, with 10 being the best, rate the contractor on how well the contractor performed the work after a change order was issued, and how well the contractor integrated the change order work into the existing work. (Max. 10 points).
- 10. On a scale of 1-10, with 10 being the best, rate how has the contractor been performing in the area of turning in Operation & Maintenance manuals, completing as-built drawings, providing required training and taking care of warranty items? (Max. 10 points)
- 11. On a scale of 1-10, with 10 being the best, rate the contractor on whether there were an unusually high number of claims, given the nature of the project, or unusual difficulty in resolving them. (Max. 10 points)
- 12. On a scale of 1-10, with 10 being the highest, rate the contractor with respect to timely payments by the contractor to either subcontractors or suppliers. (If the person being interviewed knows of no such difficulties, the score on this question should be "10.")
- 13. On a scale of 1-10, with 10 being the best, how would you rate the quality of the work overall? (Max. 10 points)

#### INSTRUCTIONS FOR PUBLIC AGENCIES

**Re: Interview Questions** 

The following is meant to assist the public agency to conduct the interviews of the managers of projects previously completed (that is, the people who supervised the projects for the project owners) by the contractor wishing to pre-qualify. The interview questions allow qualitative review of work performance for contractors who choose to bid and pre-qualify for public works contracts. The interview questions will be used to examine randomly selected contacts from at least two completed past projects.

In each question, the person being interviewed is asked to rate a certain aspect of contractor's performance, using a scale of 1 to 10. The highest possible score is 120 points. A score of less than 55 points disqualifies the contractor from bidding on projects that are proposed by the public agency. A score of 72 points or more on each interview is sufficient for a contractor to qualify on this portion of the prequalification process. If the scores resulting from an interview are between 55 and 72, the public agency should conduct another interview to collect additional information.

It is possible that the score given to any interview answer may be challenged in an appeal. For that reason, be sure to: (a) ask the person being interviewed for specific information or details, to explain or substantiate the numerical answer given; and (b) take written notes of the information provided.

#### **Selection of the Interviewer:**

- (a) The public agency should select an individual who is at least moderately well informed about public works construction.
- (b) The individual should be unbiased during the interview; this is to ensure accurate implementation of the interview questions.
- (c) The individual should not use examples or deviate from the questions unless the project manager is unclear and prompts further explanation. The interviewer should offer additional explanation of the questions only if he/she is sure of the intent of the question in the interview.

#### Locating the respondent to interview:

- (a) The interviewer should attempt to contact a project manager of a past project for the interview. The interviewer should be aware that for one interview to be completed there may be a need to interview multiple individuals. That is, the interviewer may have to contact multiple individuals, such as the project manager concerning the building process, and a financial manager for warranty items, assessed liens, and the like.
- (b) Once reached, the interviewer should review the information contained in the questionnaire of the past project with the project manager. That is, review who is being interviewed and why (purposes of pre-qualifying for public works), the past project type, completion date, and other pertinent information to ensure that the project manager is sure of the project he/she is asked to review.

#### **Interview Length:**

- (a) The interview should take 8-12 minutes, under normal circumstances.
- (b) The interviewer, when contacting the project manager, should convey the expected time which it takes to conduct the interview. This is to ensure the individual is not discouraged from taking part in the interview

#### Conducting the interviews:

- (a) The interview should examine at least two separate past projects listed in the questionnaire.
- (b) After the interview is scored, the interviewer should compare the interview score with the same contractor's score on the written questionnaire. If the ratings (overall scores) are far apart, the interviewer should conduct at least one/two more interviews to determine how past performance should be weighted.
- (c) While conducting the interview, the interviewer should be consistent with the way the questions are presented. That is, if the interviewer changes the way questions are presented during the review, it could potentially change the way the respondent answers the questions and jeopardize the overall scoring.
