Examples of Common Defects Present in PSL's (Typical)










I&I is not a 'single' thing – it's TWO

1. INFILTRATION

- seepage from soil, through cracks/joints
- The worst is <u>under</u> the water table, the <u>saturated</u> zone.
- Less intense is from <u>un</u>saturated zone
- 'Chronic'

2. INFLOW

- Illegal 'direct' connections
- Roof gutters, sump pump discharges, surface drainage systems.
- 'Acute'






Figure 1: Hydrograph helps visualize inflow as the response to wet weather flow (from MassDEP 1993)

Feedback Received Re: July 19 outreach letter


- 65 realtors mostly template letter comments
- 22 property owners

- Triggers of inspection were the most common concern
- Confusion regarding:
 - Pressure test not envisioned
 - Replacement versus inspection

- Discussed pool overflows with MCSTOPPP
- Discussed permit process with City of San Rafael
- Finalized technical aspects of Ordinance language
- District Counsel review of Ordinance language

- 11/21/2019 Proposed Public Hearing on Ordinance

- Outreach to San Rafael and Marin Realtors

Proposed Final Features:

- 1. Fees and procedures not in ordinance District document library.
- 2. Exclusion of lateral replacement requirement- home sales and permit triggered inspections
 - Board to defer decision until inflow data collection interval (~5+ years)
- 3. Normal inspection is CCTV no pressure test
- 4. Permit trigger value set at \$30,000
- 5. Inflow corrective action grace period of 90 days
- 6. Repeat offense no grace period for corrective action
- 7. Pool overflow lateral connections not allowed after effective date.
- 8. MFD/HOA/Public + Commercial Properties not included YET. Outreach program recommended
